Leon County Schools SBE Certification Eligibility Criteria:

- Majority owner(s) must reside and the business must currently be located in Leon, Gadsden, Jefferson or Wakulla Counties (Local Market Area), Florida, for at least six (6) months.
- Majority owner(s) must be a United States Citizen or lawfully admitted permanent resident of the US
- Must be a for-profit business concern; legally structured either as a corporation, organized under the laws of FL, or a partnership, sole proprietorship, limited liability, or other business or professional entity as required by FL
- Must be an independent firm and not an affiliate, front, facade, broker, or pass through
- Must currently be licensed as required by local, state, and federal law; and must be engaging in commercial transactions typical of the field
- Applicant owner(s) business annual gross receipts on average, over the immediately preceding three-year period, shall not exceed \$5,000,000/year
- Applicant owner(s) business must employ 200 or fewer full or part-time employees, including leased employees

Work includes but is not limited to:

- Applicable sales tax, freight and shipping.
- Required Licenses, Certifications and Insurance Certificates.
- Coordination of related work with associated trades, and adherence to critical scheduled activities.
- Coordination of inspections required by the specifications and local authority having jurisdiction.
- Compliance with all OSHA requirements and safety procedures related to this particular scope of work.
- Submittals required per contract documents and as directed by RAM.
- Close out and as-built documents per plans and specs and as directed by RAM.
- A safety program as described in attached Subcontract Additional Terms and Conditions. Field employees will attend a mandatory 30-minute weekly safety meeting.
- Ram Construction & Development will provide Builders Risk Insurance with a deductible of \$1,000, which does not cover tools, temporary facilities or stored materials. If Trade Contractor desires coverage for a lower deductible, it is their responsibility to provide that coverage.
- Daily cleanup and removal to on-site location of all construction debris related to this scope of work. RAM will provide a trash dumpster for this Project for Trade Contractor use.
- Trade Contractor shall maintain a competent foreman on the project at all times. This designee shall be capable of handling all phases of the project and shall represent the trade contractor in all ways during the course of the project. This foreman shall be present at weekly sub meetings, all inspections, and will have the authority to allocate labor and equipment.
- Complete RAM's subcontractor daily field report and turn into Project Superintendent at job site by 8:00 A.M. the following morning.
- Provide all hoisting and material handling equipment for this scope of work. Access to be coordinated with RAM.
- The Leon County School Board reserves the right to purchase materials directly to save sales tax.
- Supply input to general contractor regarding phasing, staging, lead times, and activity durations.
- The Trade Contractor shall implement all necessary labor, materials, equipment, tools, and all other appurtenances to fully complete the scope of work in which they were contracted. The completed items covered in this subcontract must be in full compliance with the specifications and meet the requirements of the architect and Leon County School Board representative. Any costs associated with corrective actions to bring the scope of work up to the standards required by the architect, LCS representative, or specifications shall be the sole responsibility of the trade contractor.
- All trade contractors must have passed the LCS criminal background check prior to beginning work on school property. The approval ID badge MUST be worn at all times. Failure to wear this badge will result in the re-employment from the premises by state or local officials.

SCOPE OF WORK:

- This scope of work includes all interior/exterior selective demolition work shown or refer to the demolition (D, M, E, P) drawings. This includes, but is not limited to, all work associate demolition key notes shown/referenced on the D drawings as well as the M, E, & P drawing demo is complete, bidder will be responsible for leftover debris pick up & removal.
- Overtime work will be required if subcontractor falls behind on the project schedule and expense for this over work will be the burden of the trade contractor.
- Performance & Payment Bond will be required if the scope of work exceeds \$250,000.
- Provide all required shoring shop drawings (if required) per plans & specifications.
- Protection of all existing finishes, surfaces, equipment and furnishings that are to remain during construction
- Furnish all close-out documents and warranties as required.
- All required inspections and testing as per scope of work, plans and specifications.
- Provide all layout, field engineering and dimensioning.
- Bidders are responsible for supplying, operating and maintaining their own hoisting equipment, which sho cranes, lifts, lifts, etc. Ram will not provide any hoisting or material handling equipment, except for its own use must provide all current equipment certifications and certified operator documentation before any equip used.
- Furnish all necessary tools, scaffolding, lifts, and equipment to complete scope of work as dictated by referenced in the specifications.
- Bidders must supply their own dumpsters for their demolition scope of work.
- Support and protect all required block-outs and sleeves for this scope of work.

- Work to include structural demolition, dust controls and demolition debris haul off.
- Legal disposal of demolition materials as required by law.
- Bidders are responsible for dust barricades and barriers so that adjacent buildings are not inundated with dust & debris.
- Bidders are responsible for assisting the Construction Manager with scheduling a preconstruction meeting for all team members and design professionals prior to demolition work starting.
- Bidders are required to review the Structural, Architectural and Mechanical, Electrical & Plumbing Drawings for locations of any trenches that will need to be cut in existing concrete slabs. Trenches will need to be a minimum of two feet wide. Haul off and removal of this concrete rubble is included in this bid package.
- Bidders must be prepared to mobilize and start work on **Wednesday, May 25, 2023** in order to meet the construction manager's schedule. Bidders who cannot meet this requirement will be considered unresponsive and CM will move to the next responsive bidder. Includes all mobilizations as required to comply with Construction Manager's phased schedule.
- Project duration is anticipated to be from 05/25/23 to 12/31/24. We anticipate five (5) phases of work proceeding through Buildings 1-A, 1-E, 1-C, 2 & 3; please see RAM phasing plan for order of work.
