Thank you for spending time and expertise in reviewing our **PERSONAL FINANCIAL LITERACY AND MONEY MANAGEMENT for REAL LIFE,** both regular and honors courses developed exclusively for Florida by Decker &
Associates, Inc (D&A), an award-winning specialty publisher of financial education curricula. D&A personnel is

#### The PROGRAM.

#### D&A offers:

- IMMERSIVE READER, on each page of the course, is an excellent comprehension tool. It supports fluency for English language learners or readers of other languages, helps to build confidence for emerging readers as they learn to read at higher levels, and offers text decoding solutions for students with dyslexia and other learning needs. It also offers text-to-speech in more than 100 languages. Students can also customize fonts and reduce the size, spacing, and background color to optimize readability and reduce eye strain.

## **PRICING**

## Kathleen,

Thank you for being open to discussion.

When a district has a Canvas LMS, we give the district a cartridge, as opposed to providing each teacher with our decker.instructure license, and the teacher is responsible for licensing the students, provided access to the course.

If passwords need to be reset, the teacher manages that from within the course.

A cartridge gives the district control of licensing teachers and students. We have no knowledge or record of who is teaching your course, except if a teacher wants to participate in our FREE every two-week virtual meetings for professional development. You need to verify that the teacher joining the professional development is from your district, providing the teacher's name and school email address. If the teacher must have CTE, and we must provide verification of participation, we need the supervisor's name and email.

Kathleen, we do not have Cyber Security Insurance because our IT consultants have advised us that it is not necessary. I am asking several insurance companies for specimen contracts for review. Our data is stored in Google Cloud. I could purchase a policy for \$400 a year, but I want to understand why and the risks my clients and I have by doing business with D&A.

Our course is online, and once we have our course reviewed and contracted, we will produce a 100-page consumable textbook, which is a derivative of the online course. The course can be printed, as needed by the teacher, using PRINT PDF. We are providing the consumables because we think the students need a permanent record of their goals and plans for implementation after the course has ended.

I can send you access to the course tomorrow.

These are great questions, Lorraine. I will need to know a bit more of how your course functions to answer that question. Our LMS is Canvas, that is correct. Our traditional set up is that students use an SSO to access the platform. If all content is loaded into a teacher's Canvas course without any reciprocal interaction, it may be easier to meet the requirements of the DSA—but it will not be removed as a requirement. The same is true for the Cybersecurity Insurance.

Would you mind explaining the integration process that your company uses so I can take it to my technology department for clarification?

Please note that Leon County Schools is a closed review and adoption school district. During the review process, do not visit schools or contact teachers regarding any materials that are available for adoption. Should you have business with schools or teachers that need to be attended to, you should only do so through contact with Kathleen Malloy.

**To submit materials for consideration, complete and return the attached Intent to Submit document by March 28, 2025,** as well as copies of printed materials to LCS Academic Services. The preference for previewing materials will be given to publishers with content in both print and digital formats. If digital only, a link must be provided so that all digital content may be reviewed. As a reminder, only approved materials from the 2024-2025 9-12 Personal Financial Literacy and Money Management Instructional Materials Adoption List from FDOE will be reviewed. Below is a list of required information for committee member training and to publish on the 'LCS Personal Financial Literacy and Money Management Adoption' webpage.

The following items are required by March28, 2025 for each curriculum submitted for review:

- A total of eleven (11) print sample sets submitted for review must be delivered to Academic Services, 3955 West Pensacola Street, Tallahassee, FL 32304, care of Kathleen Malloy. LCS will manage delivery to school sites.
- Bundled ordering options with any free materials provided and pricing
- Complete materials list
- Digital link and credentials for teacher and public review of materials
- Professional Development Plan
- Virtual Presentations for Committee

The district curriculum team will assist our school-based review teams in helping teachers to review digital materials and will encourage teachers to utilize the digital preview content within their courses as a portion of the review process.

Vendor presentations (thirty minute maximum) need to be recorded and shared with Kathleen Malloy by March 28, 2025. Committee members will submit questions for vendors immediately following viewing the presentations. Scoring rubrics will be provided to vendors upon response to this call to bid.

All publishers recommended for final adoption must meet all LCS technology requirements, have a current signed LCS Data Security Agreement (DSA), and a Certificate of Insurance for Cyber Security coverage on file with the district prior to Board approval. Failure to submit the DSA and/or Certificate of Insurance for Cyber Security coverage in a timely fashion may result in disqualification.
