#### PRINCIPAL & ASST. PRINCIPAL REPORTS

#### MATT AND JESSICA

Matt thanked the new PTSO officers and said he was looking forward to working with them. He noted that SAIL is in the second half of the school year, which was going by rapidly. He and Jessica have been busy with showcase events and recruiting new students. Showcase Night is scheduled for February 24 at 5:30 pm. No food or drinks needed, but would like PTSO members to attend. Jodi asked about inexpensive swag items to distribute to interested students, such as bumper stickers and key chains.

He was glad to report that the number of students with Covid is dropping and no staff members have been sick as well. SAIL staff and students have been taking all recommended precautions and have a high rate of mask-wearing. Jodi mentioned the recent Tallahassee Democrat article on school suspensions and applauded SAIL for having the lowest number of suspensions in the county.

Progress reports will go out tomorrow and he expects some contacts from parents/SAIL families.

#### DISCUSSION

The Drama Club performance will be held on February 18-20: Friday and Saturday will be evening performances and the last one will be held on Sunday afternoon. The performance showcases acts written by seniors. Due to the small gathering, no school resource officer will be needed to be present on campus.

Matt discussed the new and improved garden area – SAIL applied for a grant through the LCS Foundation to relocate and expand the garden area, Railroad ties will be used to frame out beds and the overall greenhouse structure. Vegetable beds will be edged in metal and filled with a mixture of topsoil and mushroom compost. Everything should be ready for spring planting. The current gardening class will be taking a certification exam,

SAIL distributed a flyer for February's Black History Month activities. Each Friday, SAIL will have a different activity – on February 25, Stormi and Quashier are planning a Taste of Jamaica. They are thinking of individual servings/snack-sized (think Costco) and would like PTSO to provide the food and drinks.

Matt noted that SAIL has posted openings for the office clerical position and a math instructor. Please share this info with anyone who might be interested in applying.

Jessica discussed the LCS group policy for parent notification – she and Evan are both on the workgroup – kudos!

Finally, TCC is on campus today assisting seniors with their applications. 18 students have qualified for scholarships so far!
