SAC/DAC REPRESENTATIVES	<p>Scott (DAC). Policy level issues were voted upon (district level administration). Went over Title I issues, and mental health budgeting for the district. A counselor has been stationed at each school and additional social workers being made available to assist students. Superintendent Hanna wanted folks to be aware of the legislative changes that affect us in terms of competition with private schools. Reaching out to parents to see what needs the parents must make sure we try to meet them. Scott mentioned issues of a huge diversion of funds away from</p> <p>StarMetro card – allows Leon County students to ride the city buses completely free using the StarMetro Card. Regina reported that the times of the meeting were discussed, and some folks mentioned having problems attending. Lyyli mentioned polling parents for meeting times.</p> <p>A new English testing method is being used, instead of the FSA. The ongoing progress monitoring will be ongoing. The test is supposed to be how they are doing throughout, first was a baseline. Matt discussed the benchmark collections, and the school grade will not factor this in until they establish the scores and gain components.</p> <p>Progress monitoring for IEP students and performance.</p>
