- _____ Listen to an adult & follow simple instructions
- _____ Cooperate, take turns, and share with others
- _____ Sit for short periods of time, both in a chair and on the carpet
- _____ Follow simple, two-step directions

Academic Skills - Can your child...

- _____ Hold a book upright and turn the pages
- _____ Know their first & last name
- _____ Recognize and write first name (using a capital letter for the first letter ex. M-a-t-t, not M-A-T-T)
- _____ Know their birthday
- _____ Tell and retell familiar stories
- _____ Recognize basic colors, shapes, and sizes
- _____ Count to 20
- _____ Identify numbers 0-10 in random order
- _____ Hold scissors & pencil correctly
- _____ Use a computer mouse correctly
- _____ Trace letters, numbers, and shapes
- _____ Identify most uppercase and lowercase letters by name
