

Conclusion

- Similar to your hypothesis, this is a very short statement that describes the results of your experiment.
- Be sure to mention your hypothesis in your conclusion, and it's okay if your hypothesis was not confirmed! This is how scientists learn!
- For example, "My hypothesis was (was not) confirmed. White chocolate did melt faster than milk chocolate or dark chocolate."
- Your conclusion can also lead to more questions about your topic, and science fair judges love to see you continuing to wonder and ask questions. So if you have any additional questions, put those in your conclusion, too!
