Course Description and Objectives:

This course covers advanced design and illustration software, color modes, fonts, presentation production, intermediate computer skills, illusion software, digital still photography, videography, video editing, and photo editing software. Students will also prepare for and take two certification exams: Premiere Pro and Photoshop.

After successfully completing this course, the student will:

1. Demonstrate intermediate computer knowledge.
2. Demonstrate proficiency in advanced design.
3. Demonstrate understanding of color modes.
4. Demonstrate proficiency using video editing software and equipment.
5. Demonstrate proficiency in using illustration software.
6. Demonstrate knowledge of design layout software.
7. Demonstrate knowledge of output and exporting functions.
8. Demonstrate basic knowledge of keyframe based animation techniques.

Required Supplies:

1. Mead or similar **STRONG PLASTIC** Pocket Folder with Metal Prongs
2. Notebook paper
3. No. 2 Pencils
4. Wired Earbuds (OR I have a class set of headphones)
5. FlashDrive (OneDrive is NOT a viable option when working with VIDEOS)

Sample Projects:

Students in Multimedia Foundations II will produce the following: Virtual Tour, Interview, Public Service Announcement, Promotional Video, News brief, Weather ENG, Music Video, Animated Storybook and various other projects. Projects are subject to change.

Grading Procedures: We will utilize a point-based grading system.



Students will be given Weekend Prompts to enhance creativity.
There are several classwork assignments that support each project.
Online tutorials will be assigned to support class instruction.
We create 4-8 projects each 9 weeks. The most amount of points to earn.
