## Course Description and Objectives:

This course covers competencies in preparing graphics for animation, video editing, video post-production, design layout software, presentation production issues, advanced computer knowledge, illusion software, digital still photography, videography, and photo editing software.

After successfully completing this course, the student will:

1. Demonstrate proficiency in using presentation software and equipment to produce a complex presentation.
2. Demonstrate knowledge of presentation production issues.
3. Demonstrate proficiency using video editing software and equipment.
4. Demonstrate knowledge of keyframe based animation techniques.
5. Prepare graphics for time-based media.
6. Identify broad range of roles for time-based media production.
7. Develop proficiency in using authoring software.
8. Demonstrate mastery of design layout software.
9. Demonstrate proficiency using all media to create a promotional campaign.

### Required Supplies:

1. Mead or similar **STRONG PLASTIC** Pocket Folder with Metal Prongs
2. Notebook paper
3. No. 2 Pencils
4. Wired Earbuds (OR I have a class set of headphones)
5. FlashDrive (OneDrive is NOT a viable option when working with VIDEOS)

### Sample Projects:

Students in Multimedia Foundations III/IV will produce the following: Interviews, Public Service Announcements, Promotional Videos, News Briefs, Senior Video, Dress Code Video, and various other projects. Projects are subject to change.

Grading Procedures: We will utilize a point-based grading system.



Students will be given Sweeps Weeks projects to enhance creativity.  
Students are expected to strictly adhere to weekly deadlines.  
We create 7-8 shows per each 9 weeks. Subject to change.  
Students will help create the show with their specific talents.
