Course Description and Objectives:

This course is designed to develop the entry-level skills required for careers in digital design. The content includes computer skills; digital publishing concepts and operations; layout, design, and measurement activities; digital imaging; communication, collaboration and decision-making activities; critical thinking and problem-solving.

After successfully completing this course, the student will:

- 1. Demonstrate knowledge of digital publishing concepts and basic digital imaging
- 2. Demonstrate proficiency in the safe and ethical use of the Internet to locate information
- 3. Identify project requirements, define project planning, and understand the design process
- 4. Perform page layout and measurement activities
- 5. Demonstrate an understanding of color and its role in digital design as well as an understanding of typography and elements & principles of design
- 6. Demonstrate basic skill in digital photography, the use of raster software applications, the use of vector software applications, desktop publishing application
- 7. Develop an awareness of the emerging technologies associated with digital design
- 8. Demonstrate an understanding of career opportunities and requirements in the field of digital design


Required Supplies:

Sample Projects:

Students in Digital Design will work on the following: File Management, Organization Skills, Graphics Presentations, Logos, Post Cards, Flyers, Menus, Backstage Passes and more. We have full access to the Adobe Suite. Level 1 students will focus on Photoshop.

Grading Procedures: We will utilize a point-based grading system.



Students will take 1 Quiz for each 9 weeks. The least amount of points. Students will take 1 Test for each 9 weeks.

There are several class work assignments that support each project. We create 4-8 projects each 9 weeks. The most amount of points.

Course Schedule

Duration: Full School Year

- 1st 9 weeks: Photoshop basics: interface, pixel editing, layers, type & gradients, and adjustment layers.
- 2nd 9 weeks: Design essentials: blending modes, filters, production techniques, image distortion, and special effects with type.
- 3rd 9 weeks: Advanced Photoshop: image retouching, multi-image design, shapes & vector masks, smart objects, artboards, libraries, and complex effects.
- 4th 9 weeks: Skill development and application through extended projects, project refinement, portfolio building, and year-end review.

Classroom Expectations

- Attendance: Regular attendance is crucial for success in this practical course. Please be on time.

- Deadlines: Assignments must be submitted on time. Late submissions will incur a penalty.
