1. tide [Noun]
Sentence: The tide causes the ocean to rise and fall.
Definition: rise and fall of water as caused by the moon
Synonyms: surge

2. course [Noun]
Sentence: I like my math course in school.
Definition: class or plan of study
Synonyms: class

3. leagues [Noun]
Sentence: Nations form leagues to work together.
Definition: associations or organizations
Synonyms: alliances

4. fathoms [Noun]
Sentence: The ocean floor is many fathoms deep.
Definition: units of six feet, in nautical measurement

5. jaunts [Noun]
Sentence: Her little jaunts in France was over.
Definition: a short excursion or journey for pleasure.

6. approach [Verb]
Sentence: You should approach a strange dog very slowly.
Definition: to move closer to something or someone
Antonyms: go away, depart, retreat
Synonyms: near, move towards

7. zeal [Noun]
Sentence: His enthusiasm reflects his zeal for life.
Definition: a strong feeling of eagerness or willingness
Antonyms: apathy, indifference
Synonyms: enthusiasm, zest

8. zealous [Adjective]
Sentence: She's zealous and passionate about her beliefs.
Definition: hardworking, devoted, passionate
Antonyms: indifferent
Synonyms: devoted

9. committee [Noun]
Sentence: We formed a committee to raise money for the school.
Definition: a group of people elected to perform a service
Synonyms: panel, council

10. treachery [Noun]
Sentence: He was too loyal to consider treachery.
Definition: disloyalty or betrayal
Antonyms: loyalty, devotion
Synonyms: disloyalty, betrayal

11. typhoon [Noun]
Sentence: A typhoon is a strong and violent hurricane.
Definition: a strong and violent hurricane or windstorm
Antonyms: breeze
Synonyms: hurricane, windstorm

12. marshmallow [Noun]
Sentence: I put a chewy white marshmallow in my cocoa.
Definition: sweet, spongy white dessert food

13. bayonet [Noun]
Sentence: The soldier used the bayonet in close combat.
Definition: a blade or knife fitted at the end of a gun

14. realm [Noun]
Sentence: The project is in my realm of expertise.
Definition: a kingdom, or a field of interest or study
Synonyms: domain, kingdom, field, area

15. embroider [Verb]
Sentence: She'll embroider a flower with silver thread.

Definition: ornament with needlework

16. royalty [Noun]

Sentence: The king and queen are members of the royalty.

Definition: the ruling noble family

Antonyms: commoners

Synonyms: nobility

17. concealment [Noun]

Sentence: Dark clothes aid concealment in shadows.

Definition: the act of being hidden or hiding something

Antonyms: disclosure

Synonyms: camouflage

18. cowardice [Noun]

Sentence: Cowardice is a lack of bravery or courage.

Definition: a lack of bravery or courage

Antonyms: bravery, courage

Synonyms: fear

19. leukemia [Noun]

Sentence: The cancer infected her blood causing leukemia.

Definition: cancer of the blood

20. treasury [Noun]

Sentence: Government money is kept in the national treasury.

Definition: depository where wealth is stored and managed

Synonyms: bank, cache

21. flounder [Verb]

Sentence: I lost my balance and began to flounder.

Definition: to lose one's focus or balance

Synonyms: flail, falter

22. allowance [Noun]

Sentence: I spent my weekly dollar allowance on candy.

Definition: a small regular allotment or stipend of money

Synonyms: stipend

23. proclaim [Verb]
Sentence: He will proclaim his opinions to everyone.
Definition: to declare publicly or announce
Antonyms: withhold
Synonyms: announce
24. nautical [Adjective]
Sentence: Nautical miles measure distance at sea.
Definition: related to the sea or sailing
Synonyms: aquatic, maritime
25. gauntlet [Noun]
Sentence: The knight wore a gauntlet over his hand.
Definition: armored medieval glove for a knight
26. scoundrel [Noun]
Sentence: That horrid scoundrel stole my purse!
Definition: a villain or rogue
Synonyms: rogue, villain
27. endowment [Noun]
Sentence: The donor made an endowment to the school.
Definition: a grant or donation
Antonyms: loss
Synonyms: benefaction, gifting, grant
28. endeavor [Verb]
Sentence: We endeavor to make learning more fun!
Definition: try hard to do or achieve something
Synonyms: try, attempt
29. insight [Noun]
Sentence: I had no insight as to why he was angry.
Definition: ability to know truths that are not obvious
Antonyms: unawareness
Synonyms: perception, astuteness, intuition, awareness
30. wandered [Verb]
Sentence: I wandered aimlessly from street to street.

Definition: moved around without a goal or purpose

Antonyms: stayed

Synonyms: ambled, meandered

31. passage [Noun]

Sentence: A tunnel allows passage under water.

Definition: a route, corridor or pathway for traveling

Synonyms: way

32. adventure [Noun]

Sentence: I prefer an adventure to boredom and safety.

Definition: an exciting and dangerous experience

Synonyms: venture, escapade, exploit, caper

33. curious [Adjective]

Sentence: I am curious to find out your secret.

Definition: eager to find out something

Antonyms: uninterested

Synonyms: inquisitive, interested, wondering
