1. marine [Adjective]
Sentence: The dolphin is my favorite marine mammal.
Definition: having to do with the ocean
Antonyms: land
Synonyms: ocean

2. ecosystem [Noun]
Sentence: We protect our ecosystem by not polluting.
Definition: all of an area's living and nonliving things
Synonyms: environment, biosphere

3. chlorophyll [Noun]
Sentence: Chlorophyll is green pigment found in plants.
Definition: green pigment found in plants

4. nautical [Adjective]
Sentence: Nautical miles measure distance at sea.
Definition: related to the sea or sailing
Synonyms: aquatic, maritime

5. agent [Noun]
Sentence: The secret agent is a government spy.
Definition: one who represents or works for another
Synonyms: representative

6. recent [Adjective]
Sentence: Recent rains have left the streets flooded.
Definition: happening or from not long ago
Antonyms: ancient, old
Synonyms: latest, current

7. apex [Noun]
Sentence: I reached the apex of the mountain.
Definition: the highest point of something

Antonyms: nadir, bottom

Synonyms: culmination, summit

8. vital [Adjective]

Sentence: Food and water are vital for survival.

Definition: absolutely necessary

Antonyms: unimportant, unnecessary, trivial, insignificant

Synonyms: crucial, required, mandated, essential, necessary, critical, needed

9. rotate [Verb]

Sentence: The dancers turn and rotate in circles.

Definition: to move in a circle around an axis

Synonyms: turn, revolve, spin

10. musical [Adjective]

Sentence: The violin is my favorite musical instrument.

Definition: relating to music or performance of music

Antonyms: unmelodious

Synonyms: melodic, tuneful

11. donut [Noun]

Sentence: A police officer dunked his donut in coffee.

Definition: round, fried sweet with a hole in the middle

Synonyms: doughnut

12. solar [Adjective]

Sentence: Solar panels use the sun to create electricity.

Definition: from or having to do with the sun

13. vacation [Noun]

Sentence: I like to camp when I go on summer vacation.

Definition: a trip or time for pleasure or relaxation

Synonyms: break, sabbatical, respite

14. slogan [Noun]

Sentence: A catchy slogan reminds people to recycle.

Definition: phrase to tell group aims or to advertise

Synonyms: motto, refrain, chorus, jingle

15. malice [Noun]
Sentence: An evil, spiteful man is full of malice.
Definition: the intention or desire to do evil
Antonyms: goodness, benevolence
Synonyms: spite, evil

16. recommend [Verb]
Sentence: Dentists recommend you brush after each meal.
Definition: to advise or approve as suitable
Antonyms: disapprove, discourage
Synonyms: approve, advise, suggest

17. energetic [Adjective]
Sentence: An energetic puppy ran past a lazy dog.
Definition: active or lively
Antonyms: lethargic, inactive
Synonyms: lively, active, exuberant, perky, spirited

18. register [Verb]
Sentence: New students must register at the office.
Definition: to sign up
Antonyms: withdraw
Synonyms: enroll, enlist, join

19. lavish [Adjective]
Sentence: Lavish lifestyles include the finest things.
Definition: extravagant and full of riches
Antonyms: frugal, thrifty
Synonyms: extravagant, opulent

20. topical [Adjective]
Sentence: A topical medicine is applied to the skin.
Definition: treatment applied to the skin's surface

21. enemy [Noun]
Sentence: A lion is a dangerous enemy for a zebra.
Definition: an individual who is hostile with another
Antonyms: friend, ally
Synonyms: foe, rival, opponent

22. honest [Adjective]
Sentence: An honest person always tells the truth.
Definition: truthful
Antonyms: dishonest, deceitful
Synonyms: sincere
23. element [Noun]
Sentence: An element is an atomic substance.
Definition: atomic substance
24. minimum [Noun]
Sentence: Do a minimum of at least five math problems.
Definition: the least amount possible
Antonyms: maximum
Synonyms: least
25. hypnotizing [Verb]
Sentence: She is hypnotizing him with wit and charm.
Definition: making sleepy or putting under a spell
Antonyms: inciting
Synonyms: captivating, mesmerizing
26. epidemic [Noun]
Sentence: The flu epidemic was a widespread outbreak.
Definition: widespread outbreak of an infectious disease
Synonyms: outbreak
27. equinox [Noun]
Sentence: The equinox occurs in spring and fall.
Definition: twice a year when night is as long as day
28. expert [Noun]
Sentence: The chess expert has mastered the game.
Definition: one with experience and skill in something
Antonyms: amateur
Synonyms: master, specialist
29. focus [Verb]
Sentence: Focus on the letters on the eye chart.

Definition: to give all of your attention to a particular person or thing

30. visible [Adjective]

Sentence: His scar faded and was no longer visible.

Definition: able to be seen or perceived

Antonyms: invisible, unnoticeable

Synonyms: perceivable, noticeable

31. relate [Verb]

Sentence: We relate because we have similar views.

Definition: connect in meaning, emotion, or thought

Antonyms: clash, disagree

Synonyms: connect, understand, empathize

32. detect [Verb]

Sentence: A motion sensor can detect movement.

Definition: sense, find or discover something

Synonyms: find, discover, sense, notice
