Sentence: Climbing the rickety ladder made him anxious. Definition: uneasy or fearful about a thing or event Antonyms: calm, assured Synonyms: uneasy, troubled, worried, nervous, stressed

13. genealogy [Noun]

Sentence: She studied genealogy and drew family trees. Definition: the study of ancestors and descendants
