1. edible [Adjective]
Sentence: Edible nuts are not poisonous to eat.
Definition: fit or good to be eaten
Antonyms: inedible, poisonous
Synonyms: eatable

2. compost [Noun]
Sentence: Recycle fruit peels as compost in the garden.
Definition: decaying organic materials used to enrich soil

3. conscious [Adjective]
Sentence: The patient was conscious and alert.
Definition: aware and capable of thought, attentive
Antonyms: asleep, unconscious, unaware
Synonyms: alert, awake, attentive, aware, mindful

4. manufacturing [Verb]
Sentence: The auto factory is manufacturing cars.
Definition: making or producing
Synonyms: making, producing

5. contamination [Noun]
Sentence: The lake contamination left it unsanitary.
Definition: act of making something dirty or unsanitary
Antonyms: sanitation
Synonyms: infection, dirtying

6. jewel [Noun]
Sentence: The jewel on that ring is a diamond.
Definition: a precious or semiprecious stone
Synonyms: gem

7. kingdom [Noun]
Sentence: The monarch reigned over his vast kingdom.

Definition: country with a king or queen as ruler

Synonyms: monarchy

8. gasoline [Noun]

Sentence: My car ran out of gasoline and won't run.

Definition: refined petroleum used as fuel for engines

9. consolidation [Noun]

Sentence: After consolidation, two companies became one.

Definition: a joining together, merging to make whole

Antonyms: separation, division

Synonyms: merger, combination

10. garage [Noun]

Sentence: The car in the garage is out of the rain.

Definition: an indoor space in which to keep a vehicle

11. tropical [Adjective]

Sentence: I visited tropical islands near the equator.

Definition: characteristic of areas near the equator

Antonyms: cold, frigid

Synonyms: warm, hot, humid

12. pajamas [Noun]

Sentence: She wore footed pajamas to bed in the winter.

Definition: clothes worn for sleeping

13. universal [Adjective]

Sentence: Food and shelter are universal needs.

Definition: of, for, or shared by all

Antonyms: individual

14. ordinary [Adjective]

Sentence: It was just an ordinary, usual kind of day.

Definition: normal, regular, or usual

Antonyms: extraordinary, unique, special, unusual, interesting

Synonyms: normal, usual, regular, uninteresting, commonplace, plain

15. humidity [Noun]
Sentence: The humidity made the air feel very damp.
Definition: dampness in the air
Antonyms: freshness, dryness
Synonyms: mugginess, dampness

16. bulletin [Noun]
Sentence: The weather bulletin was a storm warning.
Definition: a brief report or update on a current event

17. carnival [Noun]
Sentence: We played games on the midway at the carnival.
Definition: traveling fair with rides, games and sideshows
Synonyms: fair, circus

18. illustrate [Verb]
Sentence: An artist will illustrate the storybook.
Definition: to show or make clear by using pictures
Synonyms: draw, paint, show

19. elegant [Adjective]
Sentence: They wore elegant dresses and fancy shoes.
Definition: having a graceful and sophisticated quality
Antonyms: ugly, primitive, clumsy, unfashionable
Synonyms: graceful, fancy, refined

20. census [Noun]
Sentence: The census counts and reports the population.
Definition: a count of all the people in a country
Synonyms: survey

21. terrific [Adjective]
Sentence: Helping others is a terrific idea.
Definition: very good or fine
Antonyms: terrible, poor, bad
Synonyms: great, wonderful, marvelous

22. celebrate [Verb]
Sentence: We will celebrate his birthday with a party.

Definition: mark an occasion via a ceremony or festivities

Synonyms: commemorate, observe

23. independent [Adjective]

Sentence: The US became an independent country in 1776.

Definition: free from control or guidance from others

Antonyms: dependent

Synonyms: autonomous

24. celery [Noun]

Sentence: I ate a long stalk of crunchy green celery.

Definition: crunchy vegetable with a long leafy stalk

25. experiment [Noun]

Sentence: A science experiment tests our hypotheses.

Definition: a trial procedure to discover an outcome

Synonyms: test, investigation, trial

26. pleasurable [Adjective]

Sentence: We had a relaxing, pleasurable vacation.

Definition: most enjoyable and satisfying

Antonyms: disappointing, dissatisfying

Synonyms: enjoyable, satisfying, gratifying

27. interdependent [Adjective]

Sentence: Interdependent things rely on one another.

Definition: two or more things that rely on each other

Antonyms: independent

Synonyms: co-dependent

28. problematic [Adjective]

Sentence: A locked door is problematic if the key is lost.

Definition: difficult to solve or posing a problem

29. disturb [Verb]

Sentence: Please do not disturb him while he naps.

Definition: to bother or disrupt

Synonyms: disrupt, bother, annoy

30. cycle [Noun]

Sentence: The life cycle of a tree begins with a seed.

Definition: events that happen in a repeating order

Synonyms: series, sequence

31. composed [Verb]

Sentence: He composed a letter to his mother.

Definition: planned and created some writing or art work

Synonyms: formulated, scripted, orchestrated

32. impact [Noun]

Sentence: Pollution makes a lasting impact on earth.

Definition: resulting effect or influence

Synonyms: result, influence, effect, consequence

33. engineer [Noun]

Sentence: The engineer designed plans for a new bridge.

Definition: trained person who designs or builds
