1. The Scholarship Application can be downloaded from the HSF website after September 1, 2023.


2. The Application Submittal Deadline is December 1, 2023.

3. Applications reviewed for eligibility and compliance with instructions.

4. Applicants notified of their status.

5. Finalists provide supplemental information. 6. Scholarships awarded April, 2024.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Must be a citizen of the United States.

2. Must attend a traditional public high school located in the U.S. that is governed by a school district.

3. Must have a 3.50 cumulative grade point average.

4. Must enroll at an eligible four-year college or university following high school graduation.

5. Must maintain a four year or less graduation

schedule in college.

6. Must work 240 hours from January 1, 2024 until commencement of the 2024 fall semester in college. Work must be regularly scheduled employment performed under supervision for compensation.

7. Applicant's Adjusted Gross Household Income reported for 2022 Federal Income Tax Purposes must not have exceeded \$85,000.

8. Finalists must provide a copy of the FAFSA SAR showing their EFC.

9. Must apply for Federal and State grants if eligible.

10. Must not have a felony conviction.

The intended recipient is a high-achieving goal driven student having substantial financial need.

The Hagan Scholarship

"Helping students with financial need graduate college debt-free"

The Hagan Scholarship is a nationwide need-based merit scholarship, providing recipients with the opportunity to graduate college debt-free. The scholarship provides up to \$7,500 each semester for up to eight (8) consecutive semesters.

Recipients graduating college while in the Hagan Scholarship Program can apply for a Hagan Graduate Scholarship, good for up to four (4) additional consecutive semesters.

Free workshops, Free Brokerage Accounts, and Free Study Abroad provide recipients with a practical understanding of important life skills not typically covered in the school curriculum. Hagan Scholars have attended 482 colleges and universities located in 48 states.

1. Undergraduate Scholarship: Up to \$60,000

- 2. Graduate Scholarship: Up to \$30,000.

Additional Benefits:

- Workshops to learn important life skills
- 4. First Year: \$1,000 to purchase essential items.
- 5. Second Year: \$100 to establish a Personal Schwab Brokerage Account to manage. Brokerage Account, and a \$10,000 HSF Schwab
