Olson:

- Discussed Title I funding with extra money being given. Principal Olson will use the funding to purchase new computers for teachers and other instructional materials for students.
- There has been an increase in student enrollment. Students are leaving private and charter schools. How can we accommodate these students' needs?
- Notifying parents of school choice enrollment
- Expecting budget changes next school year with new legislation, a 20% cut
- Teachers moved to different grade levels to improve students' learning.
 - New teachers received coaching in the summer, professional development, and mentoring.
 - o The new hiring of staff and the school is now fully staffed.
 - The grade level changes have helped students grow, and the school is projected to receive a B school grade. Students are making learning gains.
 - Finishing the cafeteria construction and ensuring construction safety. The cafeteria is expected to be completed in May.
 - o The gifted program will be held this summer.
 - o Including a Science and gifted and talented special area for the 2025-2025 rotation.
 - o To increase science, additional Magnet Lab visits.
