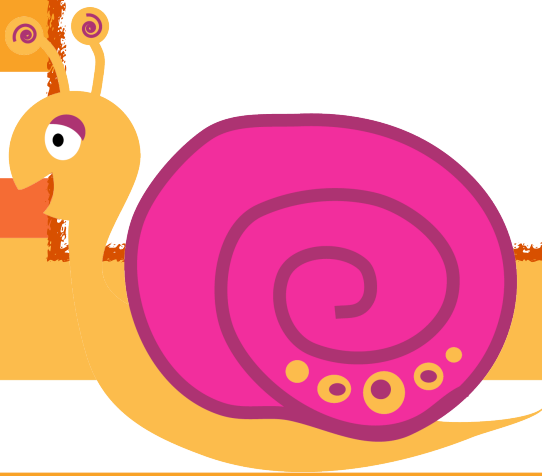

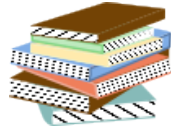
Reading response forms to use with any

Question-Answer Relationships

Knowing question and answer relationships helps us comprehend by making us active readers. It helps us understand how to answer questions better because we know what is being asked and what kind of information we need to answer them.

Right There



The answer is right there in the text. Look for key words in the question when you go back to the text to find the answer.

- Who are the characters?
- What is the conflict?
- What is the setting?
- What is one example...?
- Define...

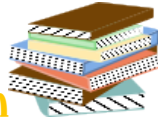


Author & Me

The answer is not directly in the text. These questions require you to infer. You need to use what you already know and clues from the text to find the answer.

- What is the main idea?
- What can you infer...?
- What do you predict...?
- What is the author's message?
- Why do you think...?

Think & Search



The answer can be found in more than one place in the text. You need to put together pieces of information to find the answer.

- What is the summary?
- What happened before...?
- What are two examples...?
- Compare and contrast...
- Describe...



On My Own

The answer is not in the text. You need to use your schema and give your opinion.

- In your opinion...?
- Have you ever?
- What do you think it would be like...?
- How do you feel about...?
- What would you do if...?
