READING FLUENCY



ECHO READ You read a sentence (or phrase) and your child reads



POETRY Reading poetry aloud can make reading fun! It also **REPEATED READING** Although it may seem tedious, rereading the same text

the same thing after you. This gives your child a model of how the sentence should be read by a fluent reader.

promotes reading with inflection. Look for poems by fun children's authors like Shel Silverstein or Jack Prelutsky. multiple times can help increase fluency. This is best done with shorter stories, poems, or other texts.

LISTEN

Listening to audio books, YouTube videos of books being read, or even family members reading can even help improve your child's fluency. Good models make good readers!
