Spanish 1

Course Description:

- Spanish I introduces students to the target language and its culture.
- Students develop proficiencies across the full range of communication modes (interpersonal, presentational, and interpretive) and cross-cultural understanding.
- An introduction to reading and writing is also included as well as culture, connections, comparisons, and communities.

Spanish 3

Course Description:

At this level, students focus on additional verb tenses and a wider range of vocabulary, increasing their ability to comprehend and produce the language. Reading, listening, and viewing activities are increasingly based on authentic resources. Communications skills focus on more "real world" situations.

Spanish 2

Course Description:

- · This class is a continuation of Spanish 1.
- More Spanish vocabulary, grammar, and culture.
- We will continue building fundamental communication skills like listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

Spanish 4

Course Description:

At this level, students focus on additional verb tenses and a wider range of vocabulary, increasing their ability to comprehend and produce the language. Reading, listening, and viewing activities are increasingly based on authentic resources. Communications skills focus on more "real world" situations.

Why study Spanish????










Spanish is the 2nd most spoken language by native speakers in the world.




Spanish is the fastest growing language in the United States.

Projected Hispanic Population 2020 to 2060



Latino population growth, 2010-2019, by region








