

DIRECTORS BIOS



ROBERT A. STUART (Director, Props Master) holds a B.A in English and an M.S. in Theatre Education from FSU and he is thrilled to be directing his first Leon High School Musical. He first stepped onto the Leon stage in 1984 when he played Winthrop Paroo in the Lincoln High School production of *The Music Man* (back then Leon was the only high school in town with a theatre.) Since then, he has performed in over sixty productions, most recently as Miss Trunchbull in Quincy Music Theatre's *Matilda the Musical* and as The D'Ysquith Family in Theatre Tallahassee's A *Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder*. Other theatrical roles include *The Drowsy Chaperone* (The Man in the Chair), *La Cage Aux Folles* (Albin/ZaZa), *The Producers* (Roger DeBris), *To Kill a Mockingbird* (Bob Ewell), *Shrek The Musical* (Lord Farquaad), *Next Fall* (Adam), *Sordid Lives* (Brother Boy), *My Fair Lady* (Higgins), *Hairspray* (Edna), *A Christmas Carol* (Scrooge), *Oliver!* (Fagin) and *August: Osage County* (Charlie).

Prior to his retirement in 2020, he taught theatre for thirty years in Tallahassee at Lincoln High, Chiles High (2001 Teacher of the Year), Young Actors Theatre (Artistic Director) and TCC. His over eighty directing credits include: Thoroughly Modern Millie (Young Actors Theatre), Into the Woods (Young Actors Theatre), Noises Off! (Lincoln High School), Little Shop of Horrors (Young Actors Theatre), Steel Magnolias (Lincoln High School, Young Actors Theatre), Lend Me a Tenor (Lincoln High School) and The Pirates of Penzance (Chiles High).



TABITHA PECK (Music Director, Producer, & Lighting Designer) is the Director of Choral Activities at Leon, where she teaches Opus, Capital Singers, Madrigals, Melodears, as well as AP Music Theory and Technical Theatre. She received the B.M.E. and M.M.E. in Music Education from the Florida State University College of Music, where she studied voice with Janice Harsanyi (Undergraduate) and Roy Delp (Graduate). Her ensembles have performed at the state ACDA conference President's Concert, the FMEA Presidents Concert, and the Southern Region ACDA Conference. Additionally, her choirs have received the "Choir of Distinction" title at the State Music Performance Assessment. A Tallahassee native, Ms. Peck attended James S. Rickards High School as a member of the Marching Redskins. She was a French horn player, and Drum Major of the band from 1995-1997.

In 2003, she founded the a cappella group "Mane Event" which has competed nationally, twice winning runner-up at the international finals. In 2005, Mrs. Peck's (then Miss Hall) musical arrangements won honors at the district, regional, and state levels. She frequently judges ICCA events at the state and regional levels. She is an active member of FMEA, FVA, and ACDA, serving as FVA District 3 Treasurer and Florida Chapter of ACDA Treasurer and Webmaster, and has been a member of the professional choir: The Festival Singers of Florida. She has presented sessions at the FMEA State Conference on AP Music Theory and on Pop A cappella ensembles and is an active adjudicator and soloist. She and her husband Tim have two beautiful daughters.



ANNA NORRIS (Choreographer) is thrilled to return to the Leon Summer musical team after choreographing Anastasia: The Musical last summer! As a performer, Anna has been seen onstage as Roxie in Chicago, Blanche in Jane Eyre, Bebe in A Chorus Line, and Nikki in Curtains, along with other featured dance roles. Favorite choreography credits include Anything Goes and Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat (Brookwood School), Grease and Disney's The Little Mermaid (QMT), The Drowsy Chaperone (Theatre Tallahassee), and A Christmas Story (New Stage Theatreworks). Anna is a proud Lincoln High School alum and participated in the Leon summer show when she was in high school. By day, Anna consults with school districts on their academic strategy as member of the TNTP team. She holds a BA in Music and American Studies and an MPA from FSU with concentrations in Non-Profit Management and Education Policy.



MAGGIE SMITH (Assistant Music Director) is the Associate Director of Choral Activities at Leon, where she teaches Prelude and Overture. As a self-acclaimed Disney Adult, she is so excited that her first musical with Leon is Disney's Beauty and the Beast. She received her B.M in Vocal Performance and B.M. in Music Education from the University of Kentucky and her M.M in Vocal Performance from Florida State University. Performance credits include Susannah (Mrs. McLean) with Janiec Opera Company at Brevard Music Center, The Medium (Madame Flora), Little Red Riding Hood (Grandmother), Candide (Old Lady), Dido and Aeneas (2nd Witch), Hansel and Gretel (Mother), La Traviata (Annina) with FSU Opera, and La Cenerentola (Tisbe) with Bayview Music Festival. With a shared love of musical theatre, she has been seen in the roles of Bloody Mary in South Pacific, Mrs. Lovett Sweeney Todd, and Madame Thénardier in Les Misérables with University of Kentucky Opera Theatre and Mrs. Potts in Disney's Beauty and the Beast with Emerging Artists Studio. She is the recipient of the KY District Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions Encouragement award in 2017 and 2018; the Carlisle Floyd

Endowment for Opera in 2016 and 2017.



HANNAH DOUGLAS (Stage Manager) is a rising junior at the University of Kentucky studying music education. A 2020 graduate of Leon High School, Hannah was seen in the summer productions of *The Hunchback of Notre Dame, Les Misérables*, and *Aida*. A former member of the Leon Choral Department's Capital Singers and Melodears (Student Director), Hannah attended Young Actors Theatre for twelve years, performing in countless productions; her most notable roles were as Alice in *Alice in Wonderland* and as Winifred Banks in Disney's *Mary Poppins*. At the University of Kentucky, she is involved in UK Choirs, serving as the UK Women's Choir Co-President for the 2022-2023 school year, and she serves as the Vice President of Risk Management for the Alpha Chi Omega sorority. Hannah is so excited to be in Tallahassee for the summer working on Disney's *Beauty and the Beast* under two of her greatest mentors- Robert Stuart and Tabitha Peck.



PRODUCTION STAFF BIOS

ETHAN BIGELOW (Master Electrician) is a Leon Theatre Tech alumni, professionally certified IATSE technician and Master Rigger. Ethan has worked shows on tour and in arena settings. He is currently employed by Ruby Diamond Auditorium and the Civic Center.

CASEY BLANTON (Scenic Designer and Master Carpenter) is a native to Tallahassee and was a member of the inaugural graduating class of Chiles High School in 2002 where he was taught by both Robert Stuart (Director) in Drama and Tabitha Peck (then Tabitha Hall) as his Choral intern. Casey attended the University of Central Florida where he received his Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre Design and Technology with an emphasis in Scenic Design. Following graduation, Casey freelanced in the greater Orlando area, working for such reputable theatre companies as the Orlando Repertory Theatre (The Rep) and the Historic Athens Theatre of DeLand. While freelancing, Casey took on various roles as Set Designer, Props Designer, Puppet Designer, and Technical Director. In 2014, Casey took a full-time position with the esteemed Maltz Jupiter Theatre in Jupiter, FL as their resident Properties Designer. In his six years there he worked on 53 productions between the main season productions as Properties Designer and the Conservatory student summer productions as both Scenic and Props Designer. Like most of the world in 2020, the Maltz halted mid production due to covid and Casey found his way home to Tallahassee. He couldn't be more thrilled to be a part of this production as he finds that inspiring youth to perpetuate the love for the Arts is so important.

LINDA BULECZA (Costume Designer) is a retired attorney and lifelong seamstress. She has been costuming at Ballet Arts Conservatory of Tallahassee for over ten years, designing and constructing full length ballets from classics such as *Graduation Ball*, *Cinderella*, and *A Midsummer Night's Dream* to story ballets such as *The Wizard of Oz*, *The Little Mermaid*, *Snow White*, and a steampunk take on *Alice in Wonderland*. Ms. Bulecza has contributed to numerous local theatre productions including *West Side Story*, Disney's *Mary Poppins*, *The SpongeBob Musical* and most recently as the lead costume designer for Theatre Tallahassee's production of *A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder*. She has helped costume every Leon summer show, beginning with *The Phantom of the Opera*, and is pleased to be a lead designer for Disney's *Beauty and the Beast*. Ms. Bulecza would like to thank all the parent volunteers, without whom costuming for such a mammoth show would not be possible.

PATRICK CAMPBELL (Lighting Consultant) is a freelance Lighting Designer living in Tallahassee. He has worked with theater and dance groups throughout the Big Bend area and in southern Georgia, and he has won several regional awards for his designs. Recent area productions he has worked on include the world premieres of two Jones Hope Wooten plays; Lady Day at Emerson's Bar & Grill; The SpongeBob Musical; Murder on the Orient Express; Legally Blonde The Musical; American Idiot; Avenue Q and Peter and the Starcatcher. By day, Patrick is a software developer at PATLive. He thanks Traci and Toby for their continuing patience and understanding of his time away from home to help others tell their stories.

LEE COMMANDER (Orchestra Coordinator) is currently the Director of Bands at Leon High School where he oversees all the band activities including Marching Band, Jazz Band, Concert Bands, and The Lion's United Band. This production of Disney's *Beauty and the Beast* is the sixth Leon High summer show he has worked on. Throughout his time with the summer show productions, he has worked as the conductor, orchestra coach, and pit musician. He has also played as a pit musician for local community theater productions such as *My Fair Lady, Thoroughly Modern Millie*, and *West Side Story*.

ZACH CRAMER (Sound Effects Designer) has been the Sound Designer for the School of Theatre at Florida State University since 2009. Over the past 25 years he has designed over 100 productions including *The Who's Tommy, Peter Pan, Ragtime, Seussical, Nine* (winner 2008 FTC, 2009 SETC and advanced to national AACT), *Titanic, The Producers, Hedda Gabler, Spamalot, The Addams Family, Disney's Beauty and the Beast, Hairspray, In the Heights and A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder.*

CLAUDIA DEW (Wardrobe Mistress/Costume Assistant) came out of retirement to serve as Wardrobe Mistress, a title she previously wore for 10 years! ABOUT THE CREATORS

ALAN MENKEN (Composer) Theater: God Bless You Mr. Rosewater, Little Shop Of Horrors, Real Life Funnies, Atina: Evil Queen Of The Galaxy, Kicks, The Apprenticeship Of Duddy Kravitz, Beauty And The Beast, A Christmas Carol, Weird Romance, King David, Der Glöckner Von Notre Dame, The Little Mermaid, Sister Act, Leap Of Faith, Aladdin and Newsies. Film: Little Shop of Horrors, The Little Mermaid, Beauty And The Beast, Newsies, Aladdin, Pocahontas, The Hunchback Of Notre Dame, Hercules, Life With Mikey, Lincoln, Home On The Range, Noel, Enchanted, Shaggy Dog, Tangled and Mirror Mirror. Songs: Rocky V, Home Alone 2 and Captain America. HOWARD ASHMAN (Lyricist) Best known as a pivotal creative mind behind the renaissance of Disney animation and his work on *The Little Mermaid*, *Aladdin* and *Beauty and The Beast* (which is dedicated to, "Our friend, Howard Ashman, who gave a Mermaid her voice and a Beast his soul...") Ashman's first love was theater. Ashman was a founder of off Broadway's renowned WPA Theater, where he conceived, wrote, and directed *God Bless You*, *Mr. Rosewater*, as well as the classic musical, *Little Shop of Horrors* (both music by Alan Menken). In 1986, he wrote and directed the Broadway musical *Smile* (music by Marvin Hamlisch). Lamented as a lost treasure of the 1980's theater scene, *Smile* remains popular on High School and College campuses throughout the country. Howard Ashman died in 1991 from complications of AIDS. TIM RICE (Lyricist) has worked in music, theater, and film since 1965, when he met Andrew Lloyd Webber, a fellow struggling songwriter. Rather than pursue Tim's ambitions to write rock or pop songs, they turned their attention to Andrew's obsession - musical theater. Their first collaboration, The Likes of Us (lyrics by Tim, music by Andrew), was an unsuccessful show based on the life of Dr. Barnardo, the Victorian philanthropist. Their next three works together were much more successful: Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Jesus Christ Superstar, and Evita. Tim has also worked with other distinguished popular composers such as Elton John (The Lion King, Aida), Alan Menken (Aladdin, King David, Beauty and the Beast), and Bjorn Ulvaeus and Benny Andersson (Chess). From Here to Eternity, with music by newcomer Stuart Brayson, coproduced with Lee Menzies, directed by Tamara Harvey, and with book by Bill Oakes, premiered in the West End at the Shaftesbury Theatre in 2013. He formed his own cricket team in 1973 and was president of the MCC in 2002. In 2013, he wrote and presented a 52-part series for BBC Radio 2, American Pie, a trawl through the music and musicians of every American State. He has won several awards, mainly for the wrong thing or for simply turning up.

LINDA WOOLVERTON (Author) has many credits, including the screenplay for the animated feature film Beauty and the Beast (Golden Globe winner and Academy Award Best Picture nominee); the screenplay (shared) for Homeward Bound: The Incredible Journey; screenplay (shared) for the animated feature film The Lion King; the book for the Broadway musical Beauty and the Beast (Tony Award nomination for Best Book of a Musical, winner 1998 Olivier Award Best New Musical); and book (shared) for Elton John and Tim Rice's Broadway musical Aida. Also, she has written two young-adult novels, Star-Wind and Running Before the Wind She holds a bachelor's degree in Theatre Arts from California State University Long Beach and a master's degree in Theatre from California State University Fullerton. Linda is currently involved in writing and producing film projects for Miramax and Revolution studios. She lives in Los Angeles with her husband, Lee Flicker, and daughter Keaton.
