We will be comparing our Thanksgiving customs to the First Thanksgiving. We will be learning about fruits, vegetables, and the harvest time. Kindergarten

Welcome to the 2nd 9 weeks. The kindergartners have adjusted to school and now they are ready to roll. Grades did not show up on report card for the 1st 9 weeks but now they will. Please make sure they complete their homework and review their letters and sight words daily. As we are head into flu season, please make sure you wash their masks regularly. 1st Grade

We are working hard in First Grade. We are learning about subtraction, community helpers, animal habitats, and focusing on character, setting, and events in our reading. We are also looking forward to welcoming

some of our students back to campus. Please remember to read each night for 20 minutes with your child. Thanks for all your support!

We are working through many changes. Thank you for all you do. We have started a new 9 weeks. In Math, we will be focusing on single/ twodigit addition and subtraction. So please practice those basic math facts. As for reading, we are putting a heavy focus on reading interventions and will continue to focus on various comprehension skills. Good news: our grading categories have changed: 50% Tests, 30% Quizzes, 15% Classwork, and 5% Homework! Let's Soar 2nd grade!



3rd Grade

Fall is in full swing. The leaves are about to change, the temperature is dropping, and we are working hard in 3rd grade. Here are a few reminders: If your child misses school, make sure they bring a note or doctor's excuse to school so they can make up their work. Work should be made up within three days. It is important that students read at home each evening in order to stay on track and reach their A.R. goals. In Language Arts, we have been working hard on our reading skills. Most recently, those skills included asking and answering questions, cause and effect, metaphors, subjects and predicates, as well as reading biographies. As we start this new nine week period, we will be focusing on continuing to ask and answer questions, Main Idea and Key Details, Expository texts, Multiple-meaning words, as well as simple and compound sentences. In Math, we are sailing towards success as we focus on the following standards: Adding and subtracting within 1,000, Reading and Interpreting Data and with our newest lesson Understanding Multiplication. The students are excited about learning multiplication in the third grade. It is imperative that each student practices multiplication facts for 20 minutes daily. We will continue to focus on multiplication as we enter the 2nd nine weeks.

As our Voting Unit comes to an end, it was great learning about voting, voting rights, as well as the 2020 presidential election. We will begin to learn about Famous American Heroes: Mary McLeod Bethune, Franklin D. Roosevelt, and Eleanor Roosevelt.

4th Grade

The first nine weeks is over! We would like to THANK all the parents, students, and staff for their patience and support. The second nine weeks will have additional challenges that we will get through together. All fourth grader students (brick & mortar and digital) will now rotate between 3 teachers: Mrs. Hagens for ELA, Mrs. Dailey for Math, and Mrs. White for Science and Social Studies, Parents and students need to continue keeping up with your class assignments, homework, and assessments. If you need help, it is your responsibility to ask your teacher. All teachers are here to help. As for Math, we have finished Chapter 1 on Place Value, Addition, and Subtraction to One Million and Chapter 2 on Multiply by 1-digit Numbers. In Chapter 3 will be continuing with multiplication, Multiply 2-digit Numbers. Science, we have finished Unit 1, Nature of Science in Science. We are moving to Unit 7-9, Physical Science and Earth Space Science. Beginning the focus on Forms of Energy. Social Studies will focus on Elections in America. ELA students will continue to focus on Main Idea and Detail, Persuasive Articles, Suffixes, Sentence Fluency, and Run-on sentences. As always, continue to read and take AR quizzes, do your path in iReady Math and Reading, and know your multiplication facts fluently. Let us have a fantastic second nine weeks!
