

### **GOALS**

- ✓ Students work in a **self-directed environment** to develop a portfolio of their own work that visually explores a particular artistic concern.
- ✓ Students integrate **sketchbook** in creative processes and reflect on aesthetics and art issues.
- ✓ Students **create content** that shows artistic and cognitive growth.
- ✓ In keeping with the rigor expected in an accelerated setting, students' portfolios show originality and artistic growth over time, mastery of visual art skills and techniques, and evidence of sophisticated analytical and problem-solving skills based on their artistic, art historical, and cultural knowledge.
- ✓ Students work out of class using **critical thinking**, research, conceptual thinking, and utilize creative risk-taking.

Honors Course Note: Advanced courses require a greater demand on students through increased academic rigor. Academic rigor is obtained through the application, analysis, evaluation, and creation of complex ideas that are often abstract and multi-faceted. Students are challenged to think and collaborate critically on the content they are learning and show evidence in portfolio-based assessment.

- Teacher approval is required, along with successful completion of two prior yearlong art courses. Teacher will advise as to which course-2D or Drawing Portfolio Honors, after student submits work samples via email.

## **ART 3D 1**

### Course Number 0101330 - Meets Graduation Requirement for Fine Arts, Yearlong











- Students explore **3D** design and build in three dimensions: how space, mass, balance, and form combine to create aesthetic forms or utilitarian products and structures.
- Projects may be constructed as sculpture, ceramics, functional, decorative or wearable art.
- Student artists consider the relationship of scale (i.e., hand-held, human, monumental) through the use of positive and negative space, volume, visual weight, and gravity to create low/high relief or freestanding structures for personal intentions or public places.
- Students explore a variety of **design solutions** like surface detail, size, position, overlapping, visual pattern, texture, implied line, space, and plasticity of materials to match their concepts.
- Students participate in critiques, reflecting on **craftsmanship** and quality in the surface and structural qualities of the completed art forms.
- Student artists use an **art criticism** process to evaluate, explain, and measure artistic growth in personal or group works. This course incorporates hands-on activities and consumption of art materials.
- No teacher approval needed.

- ART 2D 2 is a yearlong advanced visual art course.

- Create artworks from imagination, research and observation.

The AP course guidelines are based on **Advanced Placement Exam** portfolio requirements. At the end of the year, a portfolio representing 20 pieces of art work will be submitted to the College Board for assessment. Exam section score reports can range from 1-5. ALL art students are expected to complete the exam.

- Students consider the relationship of **scale** (i.e., hand-held, human, monumental) through the use of positive and negative space, volume, visual weight, and gravity to create low/high relief or freestanding structures for personal intentions or public places.
- They explore surface detail, a variety of construction methods, texture, implied line, space, and plasticity.
- Students participate in critiques, reflecting craftsmanship and quality in the surface and structural qualities of the completed art forms.
- Student artists use an art criticism process to evaluate, explain, and measure artistic growth in personal or group works. This course incorporates hands-on activities and consumption of art materials.
