Planning ahead: Working backward from graduation and keeping options open!

#### 24 Credits Required for Graduation

- o English: 4 credits
- Math: 4 credits → Alg 1, Geo, + 2
   additional credits
- Science: 3 credits → Biology + 2 additional credits
- Social Studies: 3 credits → World History, American History, American Government/Economics
- HOPE (PE): 1 credit or waiver
- Fine Art/Eligible Practical Art: 1 credit
- Electives: 8 credits
- Must complete an online course for credit

# Promotion to 10th grade:

To be classified as a SOPHOMORE by the start of the 2023-2024 school year a student must have:

- Earned a minimum of 5 credits in grade 9 and
- Must have earned a cumulative GPA of 1.0 on an <u>un-weighted</u> 4.0 scale.

- In addition to meeting the 24-credit standard high school diploma requirements, a student must:
- Earn 1 credit in Algebra 2
- Earn 1 credit in Statistics or equally rigorous math
- Pass the Geometry & Biology EOC
- Earn 1 credit in Chemistry or Physics
- Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
- Pass the U.S. History EOC
- Earn 2 credits in the same World Language
- 1 credit in AP or dual enrollment course





- Required for any student athlete who wants to play at a Division I or II college
- Clearinghouse form should be sent at the end of the junior year or fall of senior year.
- 16 core courses & test scores determine eligibility
- NCAA GPA IS NOT THE LHS GPA

Can be used at a Florida public or private community college, university, or voc. school


- Everyone who meets the criteria (and applies) receives the scholarship
