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Planning ahead: Working backward from graduation and keeping options open!

- English: 4 credits
$\circ$ Math: 4 credits $\rightarrow$ Alg 1, Geo, + 2 additional credits
$\circ$ Science: $\mathbf{3}$ credits $\boldsymbol{\rightarrow}$ Biology + 2 additional credits


## 24 Credits

 Required for Graduation- Social Studies: $\mathbf{3}$ credits $\rightarrow$ World History, American History, American Government/Economics
- HOPE (PE): 1 credit or waiver
- Fine Art/Eligible Practical Art: 1 credit
- Electives: 8 credits
$\circ$ Must complete an online course for credit
Note: 2.0 Un-weighted GPA\& Testing Requirements BY COHORT

A student earning three or more points during the first marking period must earn at least one additional point to earn credit for the semester.

## Promotion to 10th grade:

To be classified as a SOPHOMORE by the start of the 2023-2024 school year a student must have:

- Earned a minimum of 5 credits in grade 9 and
- Must have earned a cumulative GPA of 1.0 on an un-weighted 4.0 scale.

- In addition to meeting the 24 -credit standard high school diploma requirements, a student must:

Scholar Diploma Designation Standard Diploma requirements plus:

- Earn 1 credit in Algebra 2
- Earn 1 credit in Statistics or equally rigorous math
- Pass the Geometry \& Biology EOC
- Earn 1 credit in Chemistry or Physics
- Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
- Pass the U.S. History EOC
- Earn 2 credits in the same World Language
- 1 credit in AP or dual enrollment course


## Merit Diploma Designation:

Standard diploma requirements plus:

In addition to meeting the 24-credit standard diploma requirements, a student must:

- Attain one or more industry certification indicated on the registration form

- 16 core courses \& test scores determine eligibility
- NCAA GPA IS NOT THE LHS GPA
