PROGRAMS & SERVICES



Share Your Heart (SYH) food pick-up locations at our Tallahassee and Quincy offices, where people in need of food can come and receive Temporary Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) bag of non-perishable food.

***Share Your Heart Boutique**
A place of hope located Tallahassee building, where individuals and families (via referral) can come and shop for clothing, pick up food and essential supplies at no cost.

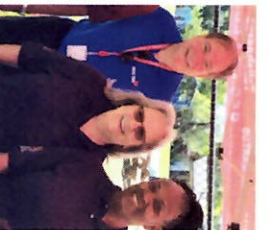
***ACCESS Economic Self Sufficiency**
application assistance for food stamps.

***Employment Services** assisting people, including individuals with disabilities find employment. (Starting Soon)

***Pre-Employment Transition Services** for students ages 14-21, providing job exploration and post secondary counseling, self-advocacy, work readiness, work-based learning experience and Career Camps. (Starting Soon)

***Summer Break Spot**
Free breakfast and lunch for children 18 and under during summer.
Program is offered to faith-based institutions, non-profits, and private organizations.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES



***Share Your Heart (SYH) Volunteer Chaplaincy Program** - Trained and screened caring adults who desire to serve their community in meaningful ways as a volunteer chaplain are deployed, via a referral and response framework, to individuals, children and families in distress or crisis within 24-48 hours.

The program was established in 2011 in collaboration with the Department 1 of Children and Families (DCF) to assist in responding to the needs of children and families involved in the child welfare system.
